- PTO starting account budget is $\$ 5,589.79$.

## 6. Principal Collins update on important things:

- Attendance: As a result of new guidelines, the absence policy for excused absences has been tightened. In order for an absence to qualify as excused, a doctors note is required. All other absences (those not accompanying a dr. note) will be categorized as unexcused. In regards to truancy, if a student is late OR leaves early from school more than 6 times, it will count as 1 absence (unexcused unless there is an accompanying dr. note)
- Botanical Science Lab: We have initiated a wonderful new program this year in which each grade level will have an opportunity to grow something in the hydroponics garden. The gardens are located outside the portables onsite. The hope is the items will grow well and the students will eventually eat them in the cafeteria!
- Band for Today: CME is working toward becoming a STEAM school (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics). As part of the Arts portion, CME is partnering with local musicians to offer music lessons to our students. Available for k-5. Cost is $\$ 69$ per month (plus instrument rental, if applicable)and covers 30 minutes per week for the duration of the school year.

7. Music/Theater Camp (Mrs. Kathy Rivadeneira)

- An after school theater camp is offered at CME. It is available for those in grades 2-5. However, club leaders are looking for ways to 'spotlight' the students in the younger grades to provide them an opportunity to be involved. More info to come about that.
- The show for this year has not yet been announced, but they are going to have a fun contest to build up excitement! Students will hear information on the morning news and can go to www.capcoralplayhouse.com for clues as to the show. Each student can submit a guess entry identifying what they think the show will be....based on the clues. From that, correct answers will be entered into a raffle for 2 free show tickets (tentatively scheduled for February). The winners will be drawn on Friday, 9/4.
- Auditions for the show will start soon - 9/17, after school until 5 pm. There will also be a Saturday audition in which students can sign up for a designated 15 -minute slot.
- Rehearsals after cast selection will take place on Wed. and/or Thur. and will be communicated to the cast.

## 9. Botanical/Hydroponics Garden Thank-You's (Mr. Laubhan)

- The botanical/hydroponics garden is in place - 7 gardens in total (1 per grade level).

10. Boosterthon Fundraiser (Boosterthon Representative)

- Over 110 schools in South Florida alone have signed up to participate in Boosterthon this school year - CME is one of those!
- Boosterthon raises funds via an online pledging platform. More than $67 \%$ of all the pledges come from outside the parent group!
- The focus of Boosterthon is to engage children in healthy activity while highlighting important positive character traits.
- CME's goal is to raise $\mathbf{\$ 3 0 , 0 0 0}$ - which will be used to purchase more technology tools for our school
- 2015-2016 Boosterthon Theme is Big World Recess
- Pep Rally scheduled for $\mathbf{1 0 / 1 4}$. Information will be shared on this day about how to logon, explore the site, and send out emails for pledge requests.
- Team Days scheduled week of $\mathbf{1 0} / \mathbf{2 2}$. This is when the students will watch videos from around the world in which different sports and character traits will be observed and discussed. This is the timeframe when pledges will be open.
- Big event scheduled for $\mathbf{1 0 / 2 3}$ at Jim Jeffers Park. At the big event, students will be asked to do 30-35 laps which equals 2 miles (note: lower grades will have smaller lap routes). Students will do the laps in different FUN ways including skipping, dancing, etc...and will be shocked to find out how far they actually went!
